

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I hope everyone has a safe and restful Labor Day.

This weekend, we return to the Gospel of Mark after hearing from the *"Bread of Life Discourse"* from the Gospel of John. I want to give a big #ping (Prayers in Gratitude) to everyone who ministers at Mass – and we do need people to step up and minister. But I also want to give a big #ping to those of you who week after week come and worship with us.

I think one of the most important dialogues we have at Mass is right before the Preface and Eucharistic Prayer:

Priest: The Lord be with you.APriest: Lift up your hearts.APriest: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.A

All: And with your spirit. All: We lift them up to the Lord. All: It is right and just.

So, what does this mean? What did we come to Mass to do? The simple answer: we have come to worship God and lift our hearts up to Him, to celebrate the Eucharist, to be nourished by God's Word in the Scriptures and the Body and Blood of Jesus in Communion.

As I mentioned in a homily earlier in August: "We're not here to be entertained – Jesus didn't come for that. So many times, I hear: "I don't get anything out of the Mass!" As a priest once said: "If you're not getting anything out of the Mass, what are you putting into it?" Or as the great Saint John Vianney said: "If we really understood the Mass, we would die of joy."

May our hearts at Mass be lifted up to the Lord as we give Him thanks and praise for the great gift and miracle of the Eucharist.
